# Together in Love

At the last two Sunday worship services we have sung the hymn *Weave*. One can hardly sing this hymn without swaying in tempo with the person standing or sitting next to you. The music flows, and the words inspire. When you face the congregation as this hymn is being sung, you will see smiles and movement. It is a motivating experience.

The first time I ever heard or sang *Weave* was at the International Women's Conference in Independence, Missouri, in 1993. *Weave* was sung at a service by women from around the world swaying with clasped hands or arms wrapped around each other. The worship center for the service was a tapestry of ribbons that each woman had woven through wire at an earlier activity. My ribbon couldn't be found as it was combined with other ribbons to make this beautiful tapestry of love. As the hymn says, *Weave*, *weave*, *weave* us together. Weave us together, together in love. At that time I realized how God sees us - a tapestry of beauty and potential. The whole week was definitely one of the mountain top experiences of my life.

The words of this hymn cover so many aspects of our lives. It talks about many textures and colors being entwined - different instruments playing our own melodies but playing in harmony - the unity that makes us one great family in Christ. And it talks about love. Isn't this what our every day life should be?

The tune of *Weave* is one of those you hear that plays over and over in your head. Soon you are humming it. The refrain is easy to remember. This hymn could be a theme song. When we sing the words and sway to the tune, it may be just the impetus we need to keep moving, to keep moving toward reaching out with Christ's message. The message that every one deserves is joy, hope, love and peace. This is our mission as a congregation and as individuals who are so blessed to personally know and experience the Christ that *weaves us together in love*.

Since this is February, the month when we celebrate Valentine's day, we are reminded how important love is in our lives. We need love, and it feels so good to know we are woven *together in love* each and every day.

I hope we sing this hymn again and again in future worship services. Don't you?
