
Celebration News

The name *Shifting Sands* has always stayed with me. I celebrate the fact that our congregation changes when we have new people come into our family. We have truly been blessed this winter with the addition of six new winter residents. We have already felt their influence because of their sharing. We, as a congregation, have always rejoiced and given thanks for our winter family members.

Another reason that the *Shifting Sands* title has come to mind lately is the upcoming World Conference and the National Conference to be held this month. In preparing for these, church members have been asked to study and pray for the Conferences. The study book, "Christ's Mission Is Our Mission", is being studied in the adult class. The author explores the meaning of Luke 4:18-19 as it relates to us as a 21st century church. Jesus' teachings give us a clear sense of our purpose today. In this study I have found that the church of my youth has grown - not old as I have - but in its thinking of mission. A "shifting" has been taking place in understanding our mission for quite a few years now. It started when we accepted God's children from other cultures into our faith movement. We had to look at things differently. We weren't a white, middle class church anymore. We began to look at people and their cultures through God's eyes. There have been many bumps in our journey to today, but the blessings have been great. We have shifted to a more open and welcoming church.

In the days, weeks, and years ahead, I am sure we will be asked to grow in understanding of Christ's mission in this world of turmoil. One thing I do know, Jesus accepted and loved ALL people. As a church we are learning how important that is in today's world. Yes, we probably will have more changing and moving - "shifting" - to do before we reach the Zionic ideal, but as long as we keep our goals on Christ's mission in the forefront, I think we can do it.
