"O Come, All Ye Faithful". During the season of Advent, preparation is made to welcome the birth of God's son, Jesus. The word Advent is a Latin word meaning "coming." The last Sunday in November was the first Sunday of Advent, and the theme was centered around LOVE. Each Sunday we will light a candle in the Advent wreath representing Love, Peace, Hope, and Joy.

The following opportunities will help you in your spiritual preparation for the celebration of the birth of Christ.

December 7 is the second Sunday of Advent, and the theme is centered around PEACE. We long for peace for ourselves and for our world. Priest **Don Fant** will bring the message on *The Lord Will Come*, and Elder **Elaine Gregg** will preside over this Communion Service.



The theme for the third Sunday of Advent is *Make Straight the Way of the Lord*. HOPE, the topic of emphasis, will be explored as the lesson from the book of John tells us who Jesus really is. He is not only a carpenter, but is creator of the whole universe. Jesus is life and light and so much more. Priest **Ginger Robertson** and Elder **Jim Deering** will present the lesson on December 14.

He Will Be Called the Son of God. The angel Gabriel brought this message to Mary so many years ago. We will celebrate with JOY on December 21 as the fourth Advent candle is lit. Evangelist **Bob Slasor** will bring the Christmas message, and Priest **Heather Devine** will preside.

On December 28, the first Sunday after Christmas, Priest **Scott Cramer** and Elder **Charyn Walker** will share their ministry on the theme *God Sent the Son*. God sent Jesus, and with his coming, codes of behavior were overthrown. Jesus came to redeem God's children.

The Prayer and Praise services on Wednesday evening will be led by Evangelist **Bob Slasor** and Elder **Larry Bell** in an informal service of music, prayer, and praise. A special Christmas Eve service will be held on Wednesday, December 24. Christmas carols will be sung, and we will hear from Biblical characters as they bring ornaments to decorate the tree.

I get chills just remembering the perfectness of that scene. We stood and sang and soaked up the beauty and the realization of what we were celebrating. Jesus Christ was born!! I can feel the sense of *peace* that was present with us that night. I will never forget it.

I guess I love Christmas songs the way I do, because they speak of all the good things. They make people happy, and everyone is in the mood to be just a little bit kinder to each other. The Lord sent us His Son that we might have *peace* on earth and good will toward men.
