#### **Christ's Mission is Our Mission**

In the scriptures, of course, we do not have the benefit of hearing their personal testaments; we have only written accounts of their personalities and interactions. Like all great books, we, the reader, must use our imagination to visually see and experience all that is taking place as the story of Christ's mission unfolds.

As the 2013 *Community of Christ* World and National Conferences draw near, we have been asked to prayerfully read and discern Luke 4:16-30. Jesus was preparing to preach in the temple and was handed a scroll. He read this passage from Isaiah: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." As he cleared his cluttered desk, the horrified man found the answer. Under the stack of papers were the checks he'd forgotten to enclose with his cards!

The lesson? Don't be in such a hurry to give gifts that you inadvertently leave out what's most important. Without the message of Jesus and his birth, the earthly trappings of Christmas are empty indeed.

We will transform the world and fulfill the angel's message of *Peace on earth and goodwill to all persons*. Vote with your prayers and act with your words and actions. The world waits to be saved by the sons and daughters of God through the power of the Lord Jesus Christ. Thank God for diversity for it is God's gift to grow us.

The kindhearted boy tried to take the sting out of the situation, however. "I don't have room for you in the hotel," he said. "But I'd love to have you come in for milk and cookies."




