


Looking for Volunteers



A special Florida Mission Center Conference is scheduled for Saturday, February 6, at the Tampa church. The conference will begin at 9:30 AM and last about two hours. Apostle Linda Booth will be present to participate in two ordinations and a vote will be taken on the amended Articles of Incorporation for Deerhaven before they are submitted to the State of Florida.



The philosophy of Outreach International has always intrigued me. We have all heard the biblical expression *Give a man a fish and he will eat for a day Teach a man to fish and he will eat for a lifetime*. According to Matt Naylor, head of Outreach International, it is not enough to give people food, or to even dig them a well. To do so is a temporary fix at best. Their mission is to educate the people in oppressed communities to work together to approach local and national government officials and voice their needs and concerns. They learn how to gain the financing and tools to farm, tap into water supplies, build schools and medical clinics and become viable working communities.

Here, in our own community, we have seen the ravages of the broken economy in the faces of the hundreds of people who have come to **Our Father's Cupboard's** food pantry each Friday for food, clothing and spiritual blessing. While this ministry is a vital necessity, it is time for us to address the questions, *What more can we do?* Again, education is a key that unlocks the door to independence. Given the basic skills of reading, math and English, a person who may have been overlooked in the entry level job market would have the confidence to meet prospective employers with a renewed sense of self worth and dignity.

Community of Christ affirms the worth and dignity of all people. Are we willing to give up a few hours of our time each week to teach, tutor, and mentor these brothers and sisters that we love and care for? Are we willing to use our gifts and talents to bring enrichment into the lives of those whose circumstances have left them on the fringes of our society? Can we share the gospel of Jesus Christ in action as well as words? I believe that we can.

In the year ahead, we have the opportunity to reach out in new and powerful ways to our community. We cannot afford to sit back and do nothing; we must be bold and move forward to fulfill the call to "discern and embrace (the) full meaning" of our identity. I urge everyone to read and read again the words of counsel given to us in Doctrine and Covenants 163. You are called to create pathways in the world for peace in Christ to be rationally and culturally incarnate. The hope of Zion is realized when the vision of Christ is embodied in communities of generosity, justice, and peacefulness. (163:3a)
