A Christ-Centered Mindset


During the past few months I have been involved in some discussions that have involved church 'mechanics'. These incidents involved problems such as why hasn't something been done about certain equipment, why didn't someone follow through on what they had proposed and why does it take so long for us, the congregation, to get things done. My answer to all, and probably many more questions we have as a congregation, is because we function with lay ministry or as we call them, volunteers.

Lay ministry is playing a more important role than ever in many religious denominations today. There are websites, resource materials and conferences available to those interested in widening their base of ministry and for churches desiring to incorporate lay ministry. One lay ministry author states there is a difference between a volunteer-management mindset and a Christ-centered mindset. She says "The volunteer mindset is fixed on church needs and finding the people to fill them, often without consideration of individual gifts or talents. The Christcentered mindset begins with skills and passions and encourages each person to serve 'when God has equipped him or her to do so'...A Christ-centered church trusts that there are people with skills and passions to meet the needs of the congregation. Supporting these people honors gift-based ministry and fulfills the Great Commission." The Bradenton/Sarasota congregation is blessed with so many willing Christ-centered persons who have served and are serving in various capacities.

Our faith movement has always counted on people with skills and passions to fulfill its mission. Not many of those serving in positions of responsibility feel fully "equipped", but they are willing to use their skills to meet the needs of our congregation. Many of these people hold full-time employment and/or have other responsibilities. Those serving in leadership responsibilities and on committees are very conscious of their time limitations and, of course, of the budget restraints of the congregation. In other words, they can't always do what they would like to accomplish.

The next time the lights don't go on in the fellowship hall, there are typos in the bulletin, there's no nursery for the little ones, or the microphone squeals during a worship service remember that lay ministry is involved. Our volunteers will continue to develop their skills in a desire to meet the needs of the congregation as best as they can at this time. With everyone's help they will continue to grow in their service. Thank those giving of their time and talents once in awhile, because the congregation as a whole is blessed as the giver and the receiver.

Remember our people aren't being paid to do the many jobs that need to be done in our congregation, but they are making an offering, an offering with a Christ-centered mindset.

Speaking and Listening

Do you expect others to believe or agree with what preachers say? Why should preachers have any more inherent authority than, say, Rush Limbaugh?

Clearly, if the authority of the preacher resides solely in the person, then the words they speak occupy no unique space and can be embraced or discounted. What makes preachers unique is that they are not rehearsing their own clever ideas to impress an audience. They are, rather, seeking to represent and explain the scriptures. The preachers' message is grounded in scripture, and we need to believe that.

To think this way has huge implications for the humility of the preacher. It has implications as well for those who hear the message. When we hear a message whose roots are in scripture, we are not hearing a mere person speaking mere words. We are, in a very real sense, listening to God speak to us. When those bringing the message believe this, they are very careful about what they say. And if we believe this, we, as listeners, will be very excited about getting to church on Sunday!


