We might even be thankful for things others take for granted, such as freedom, clean drinking water, reliable transportation and food enough to eat. Then there are the little things, such as gardens, sunrises, pets and coffee.

Wade and Lynn Bryant were asked to tell us about the Exchange Student that is living and attending church with them. They wrote the following information about her to enable us to know more about her and be able to welcome her as part of our church family.

Siyuan is a 17 year old girl from Hefei, China, a city of about 8 million not far from Shanghai and the famous Yellow Mountain. She attends Manatee High School and is listed as an 11th grader although she had already graduated high school in China. Siyuan uses the American name **Lara** as some people have a hard time saying her name. This is a custom of most Chinese who come to the United States.

Siyuan is living this year with Lynn and Wade Bryant in Bradenton. Her real mother is Wang Banglan, a gynecologist, and her Father is Yu Yixiang, a national public servant. The Chinese say their last name first. Siyan is an only child which is typical of Chinese families in the modern world. China lists as having their population of over one billion people. Siyuan will return home at the end of the school year. She will



then prepare to attend university in the U.S.A.

In China Siyuan (Lara) is average size, but at 5' 3" she is small to us. She is extremely polite and very bright; and we also think she is pretty. Chinese students work very hard to learn and have long hours at school. When Lara is in China, she would get to school at 7:00 am and get home at 7:00 pm. They do not have school sports and bands, so she enjoys the football games and especially the bands.

Lara invites everyone to come to China to visit. We love her.

I felt that a young woman there was perhaps the one we were looking for and approached her. Needless to say, when you are doing God's work and following HIS lead amazing things take place. Our intentions were received by this woman with unbelievable enthusiasm and joy! Never in my life would I have thought I could be bold enough to approach a stranger in public so easily to share the love and blessings of God.
