In God's Own Time

Books have always been an important aspect of my life. I was an early reader, who, when other small classmates were struggling to sound out "*the*" and "*and*", was peeking ahead in the reading book to find out what adventure Tom, Betty, Susan and their dog Flip were having in that chapter. By the time I entered High School, I had already raced through the "100 Suggested Books" list for college freshmen.

Exposing children to books and reading at a young age will provide limitless opportunities to learn, which brings me to my latest literary jewel, <u>the time keeper</u> by Mitch Albom. This little book is the story of a man named Dor who after years of focusing on nothing else invented the first clock. Because he did not appreciate the time God gave him to live his life and spend time with those who loved him, he was banished to a cave for thousands of years and forced to hear the cries of people who needed more time; needed time to slow down; wanted to go back in time; wanted time to speed up. Upon his release, Dor, aka Father Time, had to teach two of those people how to appreciate the time God had given to them.

While reading this book, I questioned my own appreciation (or lack of) for the time God has given me to live my life here on earth. I could have been one of those voices crying out for the sake of time. How many of us bemoan time as our enemy instead of the gift it is. Are we filling our time with so much work and busyness that we fail to nurture our need for loving and fulfilling relationships? Dor spent a lifetime inventing a way to control time, only to realize his own life had slipped away, along with the people he loved the most. We have been created to love and be loved by a God whose love is infinite. I do not know how many years I will live in this life. That is not for me to determine. I do know that I will remember to cherish each moment as a gift. I will no longer live in increments of time that control my life and rob me of the blessing of relationships which God desires for me, whether it is with Him or with others. Unlike Dor, I will strive to live in God's time, and not worry so much about the time on the clock.
