

Motorcycle Club Comes to the Cupboard

The Bradenton/Sarasota *Community of Christ* had the unique opportunity to share our monthly third Saturday food distribution with help from the Iron Order Motorcycle Club. The local chapter of this international club believes in giving back to their community throughout the year. **Our Father's Cupboard** was honored to be asked to be a part of this gift of generosity. The club arranged for the Manatee County Food Bank, through Director Cindy Sloan, to purchase enough fresh meat, produce, bread, juice, eggs and other food to fill 82 boxes for distribution. Our congregation also prepared 82 bags of nonperishable food from our cupboard for distribution.

On Saturday, Sept. 21, we were in awe of the huge Food Bank truck that was needed to bring in the food. As our clients began arriving, we shared the good news of this added blessing with them. I can't begin to express the excitement we all felt when the Iron Order came roaring in on their beautiful bikes. After hugs and introductions, they went to work setting up tables, emptying the truck and packing boxes. Cindy and her Food Bank crew worked equally hard to ensure the boxes would be ready after our clients signed in and received their bagged food. There was much shouting of praise and gratitude from those who received this bounty. At the end of the distribution, more than 325 people in our community would have enough food to sustain them for three or four days.

And herein lies the Biblical message: This past summer the Food Bank has struggled to supply more than 100 food banks in Manatee County with enough food for their clients. It was not unusual to receive only Govt. commodities, because there was no food to purchase. But through God's grace we managed to make so little go a long way. Sound familiar? When they needed it the most, the Food Bank would receive donations of food and money to sustain them. This is more than loaves and fishes; this is a call for God's people to come together in community to love and care for one another, and to abolish poverty and end suffering. Those of us who participated in this event were witnesses to the extraordinary blessings that come to all who choose to take action.
